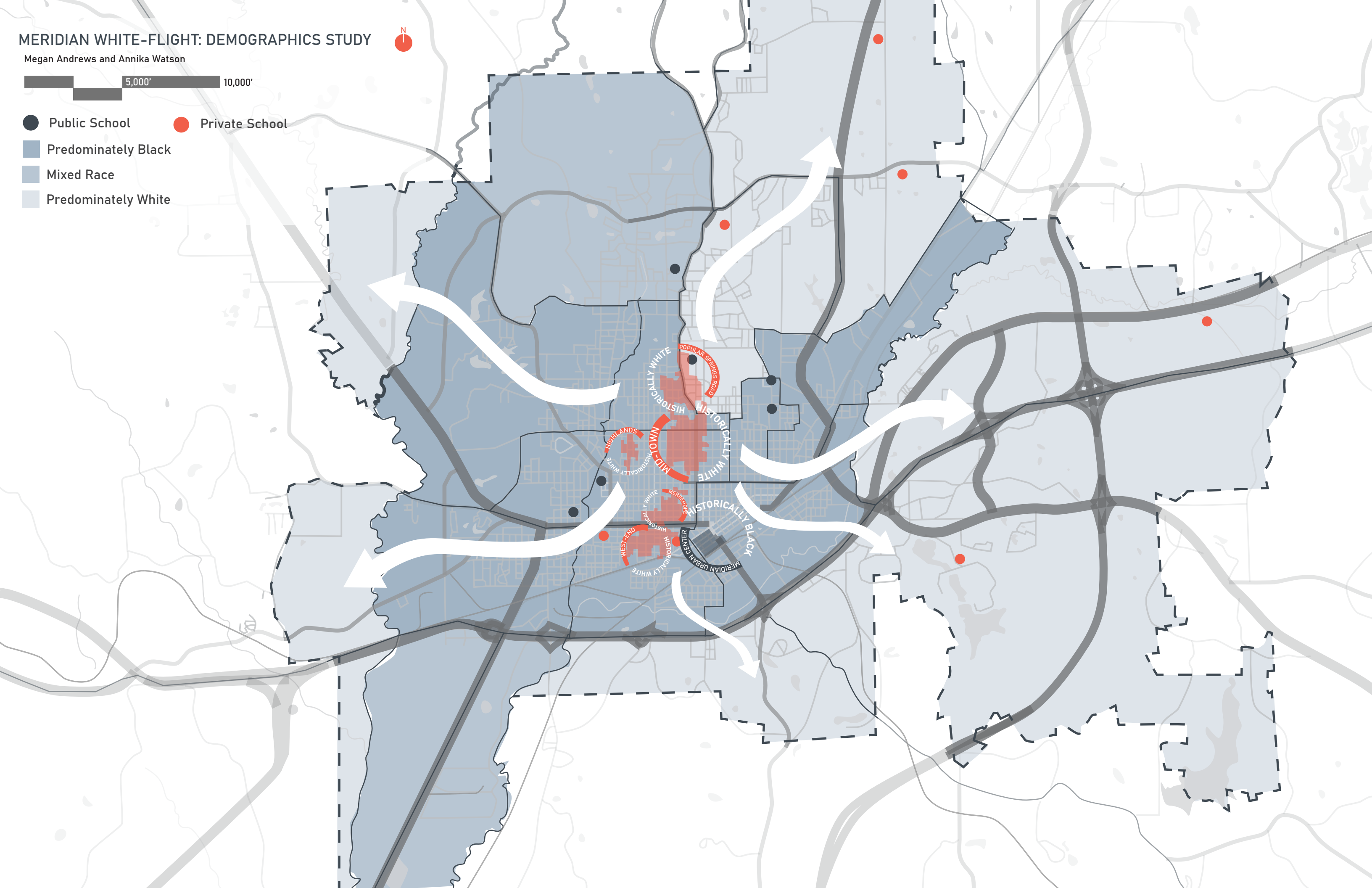

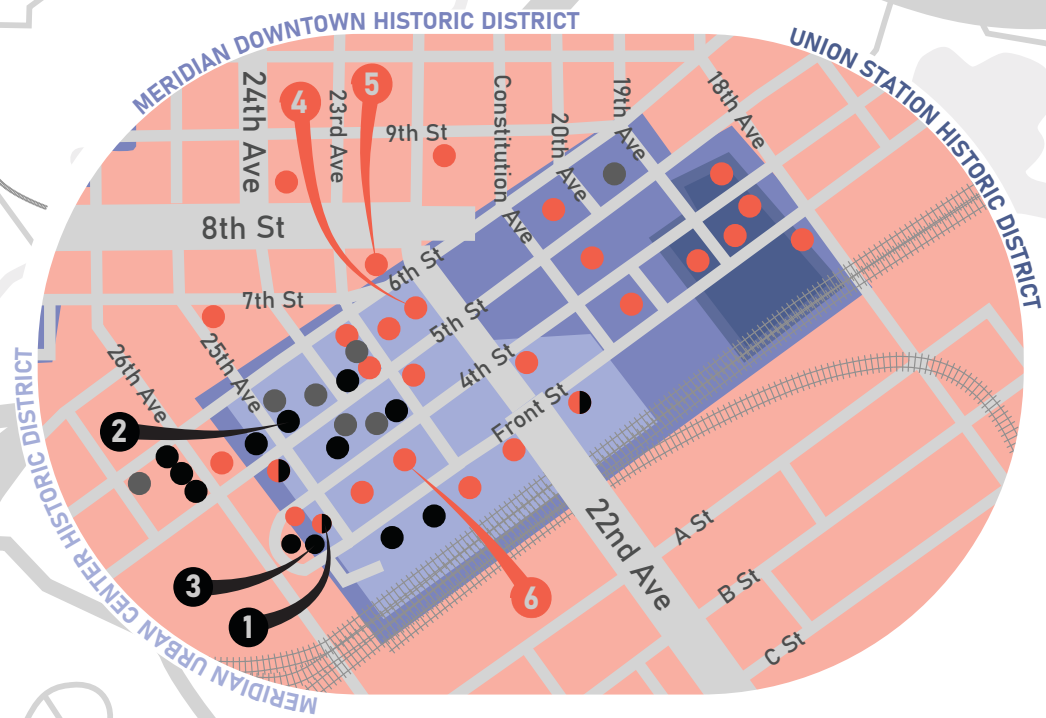

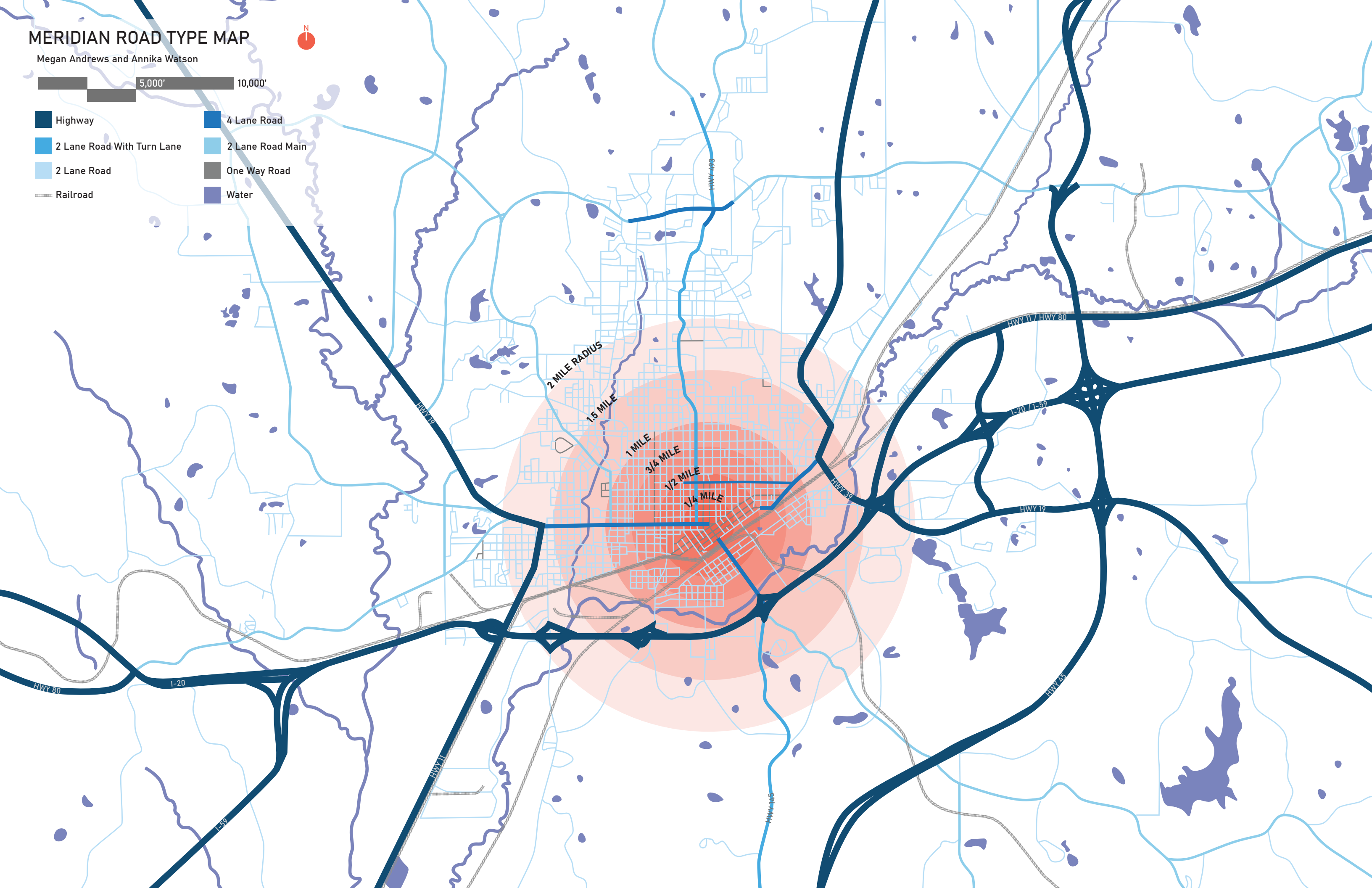


MERIDIAN ROAD TYPE MAP
